Raymond John Smith, took the theme of 'A Helping Hand' to highlight the need for Brethren to assist those who may not yet be comfortable returning to meetings adding that "A Helping Hand, to enable members to return, needs thought, action and sensitivity.

Mark Emergency Relief Fund



At the meeting of Mark Grand Lodge at Freemasons' Hall on Tuesday 8th March, the Pro Grand Master, M.W.Bro. Raymond John Smith, announced that the Mark Benevolent Fund is donating £25,000 to the Mark Inspectorate of Romania who have been working proactively in many ways to provide support and relief to their neighbours in Ukraine.

The Inspectorate will account to Grand Secretary for the disbursement of these funds. In the main the monies will be used to support the Inspectorate's efforts in supplying transportation, accommodation, medical, food and clothing supplies to Ukrainian refugees.

A Relief Chest in the name of the **Mark Emergency Relief Fund** has been set up to receive donations from those brethren who wish to add their own support by making a donation.

If you would like to make a donation, please follow these simple guidelines to enabling funds to be transferred efficiently to where they are needed most:

- For individual donations of less than £100 please make arrangements with your Mark Lodge for these to be collected centrally and then for the Lodge to make one consolidated donation into the Fund. These consolidated donations will count toward the Lodge's M.B.F. honorifics, rather than each individual.
- **Donations of £100 or more** may be made by individuals directly into the fund and will count towards the Brother's M.B.F. Honorifics

The Travelling Keystone

As our Mark masonry begins to emerge from the restrictions of the pandemic, now is the time to relaunch **The Travelling Keystone**.

The idea of the Travelling Keystone is to encourage visiting between the Mark Lodges in the Province Staffordshire and Shropshire. To claim the Traveling Keystone a deputation of five or more members to include the Worshipful Master and or a Warden from one visiting lodge, must attend the meeting of the Lodge holding the Keystone.

The Keystone is currently held by Severn Lodge No.1617 – so why not form a raiding party and claim it for your Lodge. The next meeting of "Severn" is the Installation meeting on 26th April, at Alveley, Nr Bridgnorth. You will be most welcome.



The Ground Rules are as follows:

- i) To claim the Traveling Keystone a deputation of five or more members to include the Worshipful Master and or a Warden from one visiting lodge, must attend the meeting of the Lodge holding the Keystone.
- A Lodge in possession of the Keystone may also if it wishes, take and present it to another Lodge as long as they notify that Lodge one week prior to the meeting of their intentions. Same rules re numbers apply.
- If Lodges with equal numbers of brethren visiting the Holding Lodge make a claim to the Keystone, then the Lodge that meets the furthest from the Holding Lodge takes precedence.
- The Keystone should be claimed or presented as an item under "Any other business" on the Agenda
- The Secretary of the Lodge giving up the Keystone should inform the Provincial Secretary where it is now residing and ensure that the accompanying ledger is completed before handing the Keystone over to the receiving lodge.
- The Secretary receiving the Keystone shall inform the Provincial Secretary that they have the Keystone in safe keeping advising him of the next meeting of the Lodge.
- The Provincial Secretary should make every effort to publicise the next meeting of the holding Lodge to encourage as many visitors as possible
- The Keystone must be displayed in full view in the Lodge room of the possessing Lodge at all open lodge meetings
- At each Annual Mark Provincial Grand Lodge meeting the Keystone should be presented to the Provincial Grand Master for the duration of the meeting by the Worshipful Master or a Warden of the Lodge holding the Keystone. The PGM will then present it to the lodge with the most dining brethren.
